

DRINKING WATER WARNING

A boil water advisory has been issued for portions of Ada Township due to a water main break. The system lost pressure, and contamination may have occurred in the following areas: **Ada Drive, East of Bradfield, the Ada Moorings area, the Driftwood area, Thornapple River Dr, Headley, Bronson, Ada Depot, River Street, Settlers, Fase Street, as well as East Fulton, east of Grand River Drive.**

BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

Due to a drop in pressure in the Ada Township water supply, bacterial contamination may have occurred in the water system. Bacteria are generally not harmful and are common throughout our environment. Corrective measures are currently being undertaken to correct the situation.

What should I do?

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and preparing food. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water. Continue using boiled or bottled water until further notice.

What happened? What is being done?

These precautionary actions are being taken due to the loss of water pressure in the water distribution system caused by a water main break on August 30, 2025. Whenever a water system loses pressure for any significant length of time, precautionary measures are recommended.

Ada Township is working to get pressure restored, and water staff will be taking other remedial actions, such as flushing and collecting bacteriological samples from around the system. The samples will be collected to determine that the water quality meets the state drinking water standards.

We will inform you when tests show no bacteria, and you no longer need to boil your water. We anticipate resolving the problem by September 2, 2025, in the evening.

This boil water notice shall remain in effect until results from the sampling verify the water is safe to drink. **Customers will be advised when the boil water has been lifted via the township website and social media.**
