Beginning about the year 2000, we have actively, thoughtfully, and diligently worked as a community in the art of place-making with the goal of both preserving a uniquely amiable place while preparing it for our ever-more sophisticated and populated environs. The strong evidence of the success of the investment in the village area to Ada as a whole is seen by its comfortable liveliness, continued growth in residents, and property values.

To this end, during 2025 we are actively working on developing an updated planning exercise, a bookend charrette if you will, to allow the Ada community to envision further refinements. As the course of action unfolds, we will work to share updates and opportunities to participate with all of you.

FROM THE TREASURER'S DESK

Happy Trails!

In our Ada View Spring edition, we focused on the cost of public safety in Ada Township. Similar to our public safety millage in terms of importance to the residents of Ada Township, you graciously voted to levy a millage beginning in 2021 to provide funds for the repair, maintenance, operation, replacement, expansion, construction, signage, and financing of our paved non-motorized trails.

With the passage of that millage, Ada Township raised \$15,655,000.00 in capital by issuing bonds over 40 years at a somewhat impressive net interest rate of 1.92127% in order to expedite the expansion of our trail system. In FY 2023-2024, we utilized some of that capital to connect the trail system from Legacy Park to Pettis Ave via Fulton Street.





Most of that trail extends from the East Village apartments along the south side of Fulton Street, proceeds underneath the Fulton Street bridge that extends over the Grand River, and continues east over the bridge on the north side of Fulton Street towards the Pettis Avenue trail which was constructed in FY 2022-2023. The final connection from Chief Hazy Cloud to Vergennes is budgeted for this year.

Operationally, we budget approximately \$500,000 annually to maintain and repair all the trails in Ada Township. In FY 2023-2024 we incurred an actual expense of \$346,513.25, which accounted for 90% of all operational expenses that year. Future maintenance projects include the repaving of the trail along Grand River.

I know we are all quite proud of the trail system that has come to exist in Ada Township, and with the partnership with Kent County, I look forward to the many exciting new projects still to come. With new projects comes some minor disruption, but don't let that prevent you from experiencing our trails, perhaps this very section, this summer!

PARK PULSE

We're excited to share that planning, engineering, and design efforts for Covered Bridge Park have been progressing smoothly—and construction is officially scheduled to begin no later than August 2025. This transformational project will bring new energy and purpose to a cherished space in the heart of Ada.

The first phase of construction will focus on the north side of the park along River Street. Planned improvements include enhancements to the Veterans Memorial, expanded green space, increased street-side parking, riverbank restoration, new walkways, and ample bench seating to take in the scenery. This phase is expected to be completed by late 2025.

The secondary work will shift to the south side of the park, where the current ballfield is located. With a broader range of new amenities planned, this portion will require a longer construction timeline and is slated to open to the public in June 2026.



RESIDENTIAL REVIEWS FROM ASSESSING

It is that time of year again for our office to conduct our annual residential reviews. Homeowners in the selected residential neighborhood review area will receive a letter and questionnaire from our office in the mail. We encourage homeowners to complete and return the questionnaire to help us make sure we have current and accurate information.

Conducting a review of Township properties is not only a requirement of the State of Michigan but also a way for us to make sure our records are accurate for fair and equitable assessments.

Our residential appraisers will review the information, along with current property record card and recent aerial photography, and prepare the record card for next year's market study and valuation. Part of this review process is to visit each property and take an exterior picture of the outside of the front of the home. Our vehicles are marked with the Ada Township logo and our assessing staff should always carry a photo id and present when requested.

PLANNING DEPARTMENT - Board Profiles

Many community residents may not be aware of all of the functions and duties carried out by the Township, including by their appointed boards. This includes the Planning Commission (PC) and Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA), both of whom have a very important role in local government, including and especially Ada Township. These two boards are responsible for reviewing proposals associated with land development, construction, and zoning, and their powers are identified both in State law and the Township's Municipal Code, including the Zoning Ordinance within the Municipal Code. The Township's Planning Department provides professional staff support to both boards.

The Planning Commission's duties primarily consist of the following types of requests: Special Uses of land, changing zoning (called "rezonings" or "map amendments"), Planned Unit Developments (PUDs), and Planned Village Mixed-Use (PVM) Development Plans.

The Zoning Board of Appeals duties primarily consist of the following requests: Variances to the Zoning Ordinance and appeals to staff decisions.

Members of the Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals are all local residents, with the PC having 7 members and the ZBA having 5. All are appointed to their positions by the Township Supervisor, with the approval of the Township Board. When each member joins, they go through a training orientation session with Township Staff, and take periodic training (typically annually) to help maintain and enhance their skills. Training, which is completed outside of monthly meetings, is done either online or in person, and typically involves hearing from experts and reviewing case studies.

All Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals meetings are public, and any interested resident (or other party) is welcome to attend! The PC typically meets the third Thursday monthly at 5:30 p.m., while the ZBA usually meets the first Tuesday of every month at 4:30 p.m. Meetings are held at the Township Hall. Schedules, agendas, and packets for all meetings are available on the Township's website, and everyone is encouraged to attend future meetings of the Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals to learn more about development in the community!

ADA FIRE DEPARTMENT

Did you know Smoke Detectors should be replaced every 10 years? If you have ever experienced the chirping of a detector in the middle of the night you can understand the need to replace them. Historical Spotlight: Ada Pharmacy

One near constant through generations of change has been a pharmacy in the village. In the early 1900s, James Bristol operated Ada Drugstore from a wood frame building where Godwin Ada Hardware is today. He had a barrel of whiskey in the back room. All you needed was to bring your own jug to fill. His store was also where Ada's first lightbulb was strung up and first telephone was installed. In December 1962, Ada Drug opened in a building located roughly where MudPenny is today. Owner Steve Haarman had a soda bar, drugstore merchandise, and a liquor license. Many local teens came for a pop, a candy bar, and a summer job. More recently, Ada Hillside Pharmacy opened in 1999 in Fulton Street's Ada Hillside Center and the current Ada Village Pharmacy on River Street opened its doors in 2022.

TOWNSHIP TRAILS UPDATE

- Pettis Avenue Phase II (Chief Hazy Cloud Entrance to Vergennes St.)—Following significant review, the Township Board decided to locate the trail on the north side of Pettis Avenue. This project was awarded to C&D Hughes in February, and its completion date is August 30, 2025. However, the contractor is confident that most of the work will be completed by the middle of July. Pettis Avenue will remain open during construction, with traffic being restricted to one lane of traffic with the use of "traffic flaggers" that will allow traffic to alternate north/south flows through the one open lane during construction. Both lanes of Pettis will be open during non-working hours.
- For maintenance in 2025, the Township is reviewing repaving a portion of the Grand River Drive Trail. A full review will be completed this spring to identify the full extent of the repair. The Township is committed

to a regular annual maintenance program to ensure we properly maintain existing trails.

 Wayfinding Signage – Several of the signs have been installed throughout the system and others will be coming online through the end of May. If you would like to see pictures of the signs installed, please visit our website. A bridge identifying marker installed as part of the project is shown in the picture here.

• Thornapple River Pedestrian
Bridge—The Township Engineer is
finalizing the final engineering layout
prior to bidding the project. The preliminary timeline
is to issue bids on June 30, receive bids by July
31, award the contract on August 11, and have the
contractor begin work on the bridge abutments in
September/October. The bridge structure will be
placed in the Spring of 2026.
