CONNECT ADA

Ada's bike trail network is often cited as one of the reasons people love living in Ada. The value of these trails to the community is crucial as we look at how to best connect the trails to our village, schools, parks, riverfront and beyond. Ada Township is in the midst of updating our non-motorized trail plan in anticipation of the 2021 expiration of the Township's Trail millage — AND a possible ballot proposal in 2020 to seek a millage renewal. We have sought public involvement in development of the plan through a citizen's committee and we appreciate all those who came to the November 12 public workshops at Roselle Park to gain information and share feedback. Assistance is also being provided by Nelson Nygaard Consulting Associates, a transportation consultant focusing on pedestrian and bicycle mobility and safety. **STAY INFORMED** – Share your ideas! to keep you informed of all progress, get your feedback and to share the Final Plan that will guide the next millage and ballot proposal.

ADA FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS –

WINTER SAFETY TIPS

Cooler weather is quickly approaching which means homes will be closed up for the winter months and fireplaces and furnaces will be fired up. Before lighting that first fire, make sure to have your chimney inspected and cleaned. This will reduce the chances of a chimney fire.

With houses closed up tight and more gas-fired appliances operating, the chances of carbon monoxide (CO) problems exist. CO is an odorless gas that can be deadly. Make sure to have an operating CO detector in your home. For questions about CO or smoke detectors, give us a call at the fire station (616) 676-2376.

Slippery roads are bound to be part of the winter driving season again this year. Be prepared in the event you get stuck. Have warm clothes, gloves, blankets and a shovel in your car. If you see a vehicle that has slid off the road, before reporting it to the sheriff's department look for yellow caution tape attached to the vehicle. The tape is placed by police and fire departments to signal that the vehicle has been checked and no emergency exists.

MOVE OVER AND SLOW DOWN

As police, fire and paramedics operate at accident scenes this winter and all year long, we remind you and ask that you please slow down and move over. Our crews are busy providing patient care and cleaning up after accidents, and need your help in not making for a more dangerous scene. We often need to close an entire road due to the severity of the accident or where vehicles are located or if other hazards exist, such as downed power lines. Please understand we do this for your safety and ours. It may be an inconvenience, but it's best for all involved.

and have resided in Ada Township for at least 30 days. The main function of the Board of Review is to assure correctness of the details posted to the assessment roll. This is accomplished by correcting clerical errors, mutual mistakes of fact and valuation differences through written or oral appeals. Candidate(s) will be required to attend one annual Board of Review Training Class and three Board of Review Meetings. This is a paid per diem position under a two-year term.

Time to renew your driver's license? You may want to bring your birth certificate and any documents related to name changes that occurred after your birth certificate (i.e. marriage license or court order), so your new license will be compliant with the federal REAL ID Act. Beginning October 1, 2020, you must have a compliant license for travel by air, even on domestic flights. Wondering if your license is REAL ID

UPDATES ON ADA TOWNSHIP PARKS

LEGACY PARK – In memory of Helen and Rich DeVos

The new riverside park is working through the final stages of the amphitheater and memorial sculpture. Both these items should be substantially completed in December, but the final landscaping around them will take until spring to grow in. We are working on programming and events for the park and amphitheater to begin in the summer of 2020.

ADA TOWNSHIP PARK

The shelter and gazebos are closed up for the winter. They will re-open April 1, 2020. Starting this December, Ada residents may contact the Park office for scheduling 2020 reservations.

ROSELLE PARK

Roselle Park sustained a lot of damage to trees and one of the silos during the September 11 storm. We were able to clear the trees off the trails and get a new cap for the silo.

We are currently taking reservations for rental of the Roselle Park meeting room. It is available for education programs, non-profit groups, community and business groups and private events. Ada Residents should plan well in advance for 2020 reservations. Contact the park office for availability.

We submitted an application to the DNR for a Trust Fund Grant to assist with funding for a new shelter and accessible picnic area in the park. We are waiting on notification before finalizing plans. The project is scheduled for 2021.

KENT COUNTY PARKS

The Kent County Parks Department was recently awarded a DNR Trust Fund Grant which was used to purchase a 125-acre parcel, expanding the Chief Hazy Cloud Park on Pettis.
