


A "NO-TOUCH" GIFT IDEA FOR THE HOLIDAYS

The trees will be recycled into wood chips. Please remove any decorations, wires, strings, ribbons or other items from the trees that might interfere with a chipper.


No wreaths will be accepted this year.

COVID UPDATES

2020 has seen a constant change of circumstances related to COVID-19. At the time this newsletter goes to print, Ada Township hall is still open, but many employees are working remotely from home. Glass partitions have been installed in many areas within the



building, and extra cleaning/ sanitizing measures are in place. We would encourage residents to do as much business as possible via telephone, email, or drop-box, rather than in person.



CHIMNEY FIRES

As cooler weather moves in, it will be time to light a fire in your fireplace for the first time this season. Did you have your chimney inspected and cleaned following last year's burning season? The majority of chimney fires we respond to are due to a lack of maintenance and creosote buildup. Take the time to get yours inspected before this burning season and enjoy a safe evening around the fireplace.

MOVE OVER, SLOW DOWN

With slippery roads just around the corner, your firefighters are certain to be responding to vehicle accidents and slide

offs. Please move over a lane and slow down! Our team is concentrating on helping victims while watching for oncoming traffic, so please give us the room to work safely.



Often, we respond to vehicles that have simply just slid off the road. These are called in by good intentioned cell phone callers who don't stop to see if anyone is injured. Once we investigate a slide off, we will tag the vehicle with yellow caution tape to indicate the vehicle was inspected and is awaiting a tow truck. If you see the yellow caution tape, you can be assured it has been called in and there's no need to call again.

TOYS FOR TOTS

Once again this year, Ada Fire Station, located at Fulton and Bronson, will be a drop-off site for new, unwrapped gifts. If you have toys to donate, we will be accepting them seven days a week 8am-8pm.

SMOKE DETECTORS



Did you remember to replace your smoke detector batteries when you turned your clocks back? The batteries should be changed twice per year each time you change your clock. Did you know smoke

detectors have a life expectancy of 10 years? If you have questions about the age of your detectors or how many you should have in your home, give us a call. Equally important is a Carbon Monoxide (CO) detector. These devices can detect poisonous, odorless gases in your home. The gas may come from faulty furnaces, water heaters and other gas appliances. Get a detector and save a life.

Right now, Ada's beloved covered bridge is decorated for the holiday season. Back in the 1970s, a "sculpture" adorned the bridge year-round. A five-ton propeller from a generator at Ada's dam was lifted from the bottom of the river, painted, and put on display. It became known as "Ada's Dam Thing" or "Ada's Calder" (referring to Grand Rapids' La Grande Vitesse by Alexander Calder also installed in 1969).

2020 ELECTION UPDATES

The November 2020 presidential election is now behind us. Ada saw 9,798 of its 11,843 registered voters turn out to vote, for a nearly 83% voter turnout. Approximately 53% voted via absentee ballot, while approximately 30% voted at the polling places on election day.

In Ada Township, President Trump defeated former Vice President Biden by 51% to 48%, John James defeated Gary Peters 57% to 42%, and Peter Meijer defeated Hillary Scholten 57% to 43%.

Newly-elected officials for Ada Township are Supervisor Ross Leisman and Trustee Chris Winczewski. Returning are treasurer Kevin Moran, clerk Jackie Smith, and trustees Dan Hurwitz, Catherine Jacobs, and Bob Proos. To address some of the issues brought up by the media . . .

Ada Township checked names/addresses and verified signatures on all of its absentee ballots.

Ada Township routinely removes people who have passed away from its voter rolls (and rejects the ballot if it has been returned for the current election).

Ada Township uses Flair pens for voting at the polls and provided these pens for people to use and take (because of COVID-19 issues). These are the pens recommended by the manufacturer of the tabulators. Their clear markings and quick drying work well for the tabulators. Slow-drying ink, especially gel pens, will leave residue and damage the tabulators, causing breakdown and requiring costly repairs.

Thanks go to staff, the election inspectors, and the public for a successful election. As always, if you have any questions or comments about the election and its process, feel free to call the Clerk's Office.

ADA TOWNSHIP PARKS & PRESERVES

Ada Township Park 1180 Buttrick Ave. 57 acres. Park office, Learning Center, shelters, arboretum, softball and soccer fields, tennis and pickleball courts, basketball court, playground, pond, trails, picnic areas.

Roselle Park 1010 Grand River Dr. NE. 247 acres. Restrooms, meeting room, picnic area, playground, paved and non-paved trails, observation decks, natural areas, Grand River shoreline.

Legacy Park 7450 River Street in Ada Village. Thornapple River view, playground, picnic plaza, paved trail, restrooms, Van Andel Family Pavilion.

Leonard Field Park & Ada Covered Bridge 7490 Thornapple River Dr. 2 acres. Softball field, bike path, Thornapple River overlook deck, Ada Covered Bridge.

<u>Carl Creek Crossings Preserve</u> 6230 Grand River Drive. 8 acres. Non-paved trails, creek access.

Grand River Natural Area Grand River Drive, enter via Ada Moorings. 110 acres. Trails, bike path, Grand River shoreline.



Walking and Bike Paths: Located throughout the Township and in several Parks. Maps available.

PARK RULES AND USE

COVID-19: Some facilities and amenities may be limited in use or closed. Recommended protocols are still in place.

Park Hours: Park grounds are open dawn to dusk.

Dog Policy: Township ordinances require dogs to be on a leash and cleaned up after in all parks and preserves.

Motorized recreation vehicles are not allowed.

Alcohol is not allowed in the parks or park facilities.

FACILITY RESERVATIONS AND RENTALS

We are still taking reservations for facility use and rentals with new COVID-19 restrictions and guidelines in place. Contact the Park office for availability, restrictions, scheduling and fees.

UPDATES ON PARKS, PRESERVES & TRAILS

COVID-19 - Please Keep Safe

While most outdoor amenities and restrooms remain open, indoor facilities remain limited for use. We ask everyone to practice social distancing and good sanitation, and to wear masks as directed for as long as is necessary.

Wi-Fi Added to the Parks

Thanks to a grant from Kent County, public Wi-Fi access is now available in Ada, Legacy, Roselle and Leonard Field parks. Access will appear on your device as "Name of Park Public Wi-Fi".

LEGACY PARK - In Memory of Helen and Rich DeVos

A short season of activities were held at the new "Van Andel Family Pavilion" due to COVID-19, but we are planning ahead for 2021. Groups or organizations interested in reserving the Pavilion should contact the Park office for details after January 30, 2021. If you are interested in sponsoring events or concerts, let us know.

LEONARD FIELD PARK

Following the framework of the new park Master Plan, we will be implementing improvements to the park over the next few years. Upgrading the ball field lighting is targeted for spring of 2021, with other improvements targeted for 2022 and 2023. Details will be available through the Park office this winter, including opportunities for donations.

ROSELLE PARK

- Rental of the room in the building is still limited due to COVID-19 protocols. Contact the Park office for updates.
- Recent improvements to the non-paved trails in the north section will allow better access through wet areas.
- XC skiing is welcome, but trails are not groomed. Walkers, please walk to the side of ski tracks.
- A new park shelter, accessible picnic area and playground improvements are planned for 2021. Contact the Park office on how your donations can help.

ADA TOWNSHIP PARK

- The restroom at the Shelter is closed up for the winter; it will re-open April 1, 2021. A port-a-john is located by the Park office.
- Some tables will be available in the Shelter and Gazebos for general use.
- Ada residents may now contact the Park office for scheduling 2021 reservations.

BIKE PATHS AND NON-MOTORIZED TRAILS

- Please be careful on slippery pavement and boardwalks.
- Thanks to everyone for your support of a new trail millage.
- We aim to keep the trails clear of debris and snow through the winter, but some days take longer to get it all done.
