You may have heard by now that there will be an election on May 2. The KISD (Kent Intermediate School District) is asking for .9 mills for operating funds in all the school districts in Kent County. Ada Township lies in three school districts: Forest Hills, Lowell, and Northview. This millage request is the only item you will see on your ballot.

## **SPRING SEVERE WEATHER TIPS:**

As spring arrives so does the chance of severe weather. Ada Township is prepared with seven tornado sirens located throughout the Township. The sirens are tested at noon the first Friday of each month from April thru October. When you hear the siren at other times you should seek shelter and tune into a news station for weather updates. Here are just a few tips to help you in the event of severe weather.

Wires down are a common occurrence during high winds and storms. STAY AWAY from all downed wires, call 9-1-1, and your Ada Firefighters will be on scene quickly to make the area safe until the utility company arrives.

Lightning is most common from May thru September, killing an average of 49 people per year. If you are outside during a lightning storm, head for a permanent structure....DO NOT stand under trees. "When the thunder roars, go indoors!"

Tornados strike Michigan on average about a dozen times per year. Although not a high number, the destruction can be devastating. If a tornado is in the area, quickly move indoors to the lowest level of your home away from windows.

For all emergencies you should have a plan, and a kit which includes water, food, flashlight and a device to monitor weather.

## A NOTE FROM THE TREASURER'S OFFICE...

**Taxes due:** Real property taxes for 2016 are due in our office no later than 5:00pm on Tuesday, February 28, 2017. Thereafter, we will have turned our tax rolls over to the Kent County Treasurer's office, and you will need to settle with the county. Our office will no longer be able to accept payment of your 2016 real property taxes! If you have yet to pay your 2016 real property taxes, and the calendar has turned to March, please contact the Kent County Treasurer's office at 616-632-7500.

All 2016 and prior personal property taxes (business owners) that are past due can still be paid at the Ada Township office. Please contact us at 616-676-9191 for an updated amount owed.

Ada Township bond refunding initiative: In 2007, Ada Township issued Capital Improvement Bonds in the amount of \$4,575,000 for the purpose of defraying part of the cost of expansion, construction and the equipping of the Township's non-motorized trail system, its related improvements, and interest in land.

Due to a very favorable interest rate environment, the township has the opportunity in 2017 to refund the remaining maturities of that bond issue in order to realize a significant savings to our debt service costs. Those remaining maturities amount to \$1,750,000, with the longest maturity date being May 1st 2021.

As your Treasurer, I hope to pass along many more examples of good stewardship of your taxpayer money within this space, keeping the best interests of you as citizens and taxpayers of Ada Township foremost in our mind.

## **NEWS FROM OUR ADA FIRE DEPT**

Ada Township has an Open Burning Ordinance which prohibits the burning of leaves and grass clippings in areas of the Township south of Fulton Street and west of the Grand River. Burning of shrubbery, brush, and tree trimmings is allowed in this area during the months of November through April with a **Burning Permit** which can be obtained from the Clerk's Office or by

## which can be obtained from the Clerk's Office or by phone 676-9191 ext. 29.

Open Burning is allowed in the other areas of the Township at any time with a permit.

Open Burning of trash and other debris in any area of the Township is prohibited by the Ordinance.

#### Other requirements of the Ordinance are:

The fire must be out by dusk

The fire must be in an area accessible by the Fire Department

A responsible person must be present

Don't burn when it is windy

A method of extinguishing the fire must be present; hose, shovel and dirt, or a fire extinguisher



# Recreational Fires are allowed at any time without a permit but there are a few rules:

The pile of sticks and other material used as fuel must be 3 feet or less in diameter and not more than 2 feet in height.

The fire must be at least 25 feet from any structure.

Dead grass, leaves, or other debris that can burn must be cleared from around the fire.

The fire must be constantly attended.

A means of extinguishment such as a hose, dirt and a shovel, or a fire extinguisher must be present.

If you are using a Portable Outdoor Fireplace it cannot be on a deck and must be 15 feet from a structure.

With any type of outdoor burning if the smoke is offensive or objectionable to your neighbors, the fire must be put out.

**IDENTIFICATION IS REQUIRED** to verify your residency within the townships of Ada or Cascade. If you live in Grand Rapids Township but your mailing address is Ada, you do not qualify.

## SPRING LEAF PICK-UP TUESDAY, APRIL 18 AND TUESDAY, MAY 16

Spring leaf pickup will be held on Tuesday, April 18 and Tuesday, May 16 this year.

This pick-up is available to residents with houses south of Fulton and west of the Grand River.

Residents must use the special Ada Township leaf bags which are available to purchase at the



Ada Township Hall, Treasurer's Office for .75 cents per bag.

When you make a leaf bag purchase, you are put on "the list" for the pick-up service (each season).

If you are going to be using leaf bags from last season, it is recommended to call the Ada Township Hall @ 676-9191 ext. 27, to request a pick-up this year.

## SOLICITORS

For your protection, Ada Township has a solicitation ordinance. Anyone wishing to solicit in the township must obtain a permit from the Township Clerk's office. Permits are good for 30 days but can be renewed. There is a \$50 fee for every permit. Background checks are mandatory.



Schools, churches, government, charities, nonprofit or religious organizations are exempt from the permit process but must preregister with the Clerk's Office. Violation of the ordinance is subject to a misdemeanor criminal charge with a fine and/or imprisonment. Solicitation dates and times are: April 1 to September 30, 9A – 7P; October 1 to March 31, 9A – 5P.

If someone shows up at your door and does not have an Ada Township Solicitation permit attached to their clothing in plain sight, is not respectful to you, or violates the ordinance in any way, please call Kent County Sheriff's Department At (616) 632-6220 or (616) 632-6100.


