WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE TOWNSHIP THIS SPRING

This is a brief synopsis of noteworthy activity in the township in the months of March, April and May. This list may be incomplete in that some activities have not yet been approved by the Board of Trustees. Please check the website for details and updates.

Road Closings:

<u>The West Michigan Stage Race</u> on Friday, May 17, 2013; Pettis Avenue from Honey Creek to Knapp Street will be closed to thru traffic, from 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

Run 4 A Cause...Our Kids' 5K Race on Saturday, June 5, 2013; the following roads will be closed from 8:20 a.m. until 9:50 a.m.: Ada Drive will be closed between Ada Elementary and Thornapple. Thornapple will be closed between Fulton and Buttrick. Ada Drive will be open by 9:30 am; Thornapple will still be closed at Buttrick to Ada Drive due to the Family Fun Run at 9:30 a.m.

<u>Grand Rapids Triathlon</u> on Sunday, June 9. Starts and ends in Ada. Road closures: Buttrick Drive from Grand River Drive to where they intersect and Thornapple Drive from Buttrick to Ada Drive will be closed the evening of June 8 and during the day of June 9. Projects:

Ada Drive Water Tank Painting: The Township Board approved the bid from Kountoupes Painting of Lincoln Park, Michigan, to paint the tower. Painting will occur between April and May, weather permitting and prior to peak water usage.

M-21 Bridge Connection Trail Improvement Project: The Township Board approved authorization to proceed to obtain proposals for the section of non-motorized trail on Pettis Avenue, through a wooded section of property to Fulton and across the new M-21 bridge over the Grand River to Ada Drive. The project is planned to be completed this summer.

The Roselle Park Improvement Project Phase 1: The Township Board approved authorization to proceed to obtain proposals for the construction of Phase 1 of the Roselle Park Improvement Project which includes a new entrance and driveway across from Michigan Street, a gravel parking lot with lighting, and an improved playground area near the silos. Construction is anticipated to begin this spring and be completed by late summer.

A NOTE FROM THE TREASURER'S OFFICE.....

Real Property taxes were due in our office no later than February 28, 2013 5:00 p.m. We have made our settlement with the Kent County Treasurer's Office and the tax roll has now become theirs. If you have not paid your 2012 and prior real property taxes, please contact their office at (616) 632-7500. All 2012 and prior personal property taxes (business owners) that are past due are paid at our office. Please contact us for current amount owing.

The 2013 dog licenses were available in our office only through February 28, 2013. After this date, they are available at the Kent County Animal Shelter at 740 Fuller NE, Grand Rapids (616) 632-7300 or at the Kent County Treasurer's Office 300 Monroe, Grand Rapids (616) 632-7500. It is a State of Michigan Law that ALL dogs 4 months or older be licensed annually. Please contact either office at the above numbers for further information.

Need your property tax information to file your federal and state income tax and we are not open? You may find all the information needed on our website www.adatownshipmi.com. Go to the "services" tab at the top of our website and click on property/tax/utility lookup.

Attention "snow-birds" if you have not done so yet, please pick-up or request a Temporary Mailing request form to change your mailing address back to your property address. It is up to all property owners to fill out a temporary mail request when leaving for and returning from your winter address. This is so we can cut down on trying to locate you when mailing your summer and winter taxes. And YES this must be done every time you leave and return. Any questions, you can call our office (616) 676-9191 ext 27 or 23. You may also speak to someone in the Assessing office at (616) 676-9191 ext 26. EAST PRECINCT NEWS

Spring is shortly around the corner and so are solicitors. Remember that the East Precinct has a solicitation ordinance. That said, a solicitor has to have a permit to knock on your door. They should have an ID card from the township and it must be visible.

This permit from the Township means that the person has had some type of screening done. The solicitor must meet standards before he/she can solicit door to door in your community. Those that do not get a permit may have been denied or would not have passed the screening process from the Township.

We encourage citizens to call the Sheriff's office if non permitted solicitors are in your neighborhood. Dispatch non emergency number is (616) 632-6100. Along with the warm weather people will be outside more walking and biking. Be cautious of them. Please watch speed and pay close attention especially in neighborhoods. I have a few bike safety tips to remind you before spring.

ASSESSOR'S OFFICE

Please inform the Assessor's office of your mailing address updates

Please contact our office within thirty days after a change of address occurs to update your mailing information. This will help with the delivery of assessment change notices and tax bills. Our office number is (616) 676-9191 ext 26.

Assessment Change Notices

Towards the end of February the assessment change notices will be mailed. Hearings by the Board of Review will be held the week of March 11th. Appointments are needed and will be scheduled after the notices are sent. You need to provide sales data or an appraisal to substantiate what you believe the value should be. Your documents are part of the board of review minutes and will not be returned. Sales data and comparative assessment information will be available for your review in the Assessor's Office after the notices have been mailed. When you receive your Assessment Notice at the end of February, look it over and call with any questions, or to schedule an appointment with the Board of Review.

Did you know?

- Your taxable value can never exceed your assessed value.
- It is your responsibility as a taxpayer to review your property record card periodically to be sure you agree with all the information that is currently of record.
- The assessor is not permitted by State Law to automatically set your new assessment at one half of your purchase price.
- The assessing staff is available Monday thru Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Feel free to come in or call 676-9191 ext 26 if you have any questions on your property. The assessing system is quite complex, and we are always willing to help our taxpayers understand how the system works.

2013 CPI IS RELEASED

The numbers are in and the calculations have been made; it is now official. The State Tax Commission has announced that the official inflation factor to be used for calculating taxable values for the coming year is 2.4 percent.

FIELD REVIEW NOTICE

The Assessor is required to appraise, for tax purposes, all real and personal property within the Township. Michigan Statute requires that all property be evaluated annually based on current market conditions. This evaluation requires an inspection of each property in the Township.

This includes measuring all buildings and other property improvements on the property, taking current digital photos of the property, verifying the buildings current physical condition, reviewing the amenities present, and interviewing the property owners to determine bedrooms, baths, and type of basement, etc.

The State of Michigan has recommended that 20% of properties in a governmental unit be visited each year to review assessment record accuracy and to ensure that properties are being appraised and assessed at 50% of the market value. In efforts to continually improve our excellent standards, the Assessor's office strives to enhance the annual review process and better meet or exceed the State of Michigan's expectations. The goal is that the Assessing office will review at least 20% a year of the Township, then every single property is visited at least once every 5 years.

If one of the inspectors from the Township arrives wearing a Township issued I.D. badge and carrying a clipboard and digital camera and knocks on your door requesting to review your property, please welcome them. Accurate assessments benefit everyone in the community.

Dog Policy: Township ordinances require dogs to be on a leash and cleaned up after in all parks.

Ada Park Shelter & Gazebo Rentals and Reservations: Available April through October. For rates, availability, use policies or reservations, contact the Park office.

Athletic Fields: Fields at Ada Park and Leonard Field are used for area leagues and instructional programs. Contact the Park office for information, schedules or reservation.

Basketball & Tennis Courts: at Ada Park are open to the public except during scheduled lessons and programs. Tennis Courts #5 and #6 are set up for Pickle Ball. Check with the office for schedules or to reserve a time.

Update on Ada Township Parks

Ada Township Park improvements over the past two years include upgrading the playground, adding a new parking area along Grand River Drive and re-paving the accessible trial through the woods. We thank the community for their support in making this Park a wonderful place for all visitors to enjoy.



Roselle Park's Master Plan was updated this winter allowing us to move forward on the next development phase. During this spring and summer there will be some construction in the park near Grand River Drive. A new entrance and driveway into the Park will be developed across from Michigan Street. A parking lot will be established but left as gravel for the short term with lights and some landscape trees. In addition, a playground area will be established next to the silos. This phase of work is preliminary to building a Community Center on the site, possibly in 2014. Designing the building will take place this year.
