

Our **Grand Marshall** for this year's 4TH of July Parade will be Jim Decker. Jim lives next door to the Ada Township offices on Thornapple River Drive, and so has been a friendly, often seen neighbor for many years.

Jim and his wife Patricia were married on August 19TH, 1960, and moved to Ada Township in 1970, into the house they

still live in today, and where they raised three sons: Eric, Aaron, and Andrew. Jim taught remedial reading and English at South High School and Westwood Middle School before retiring and taking up woodworking as a hobby.

Working in his woodshop one September morning that also happened to be his birthday, he decided to go back into the house and watch the news. It was on that morning that he watched in horror the events of 9/11. It was this historic day that triggered his passion for these projects: framed pictures, on behalf of the people of Ada Township, to the World Trade Center and Pentagon; a wooden notebook containing 3,000 signatures of Ada residents for the World Trade Center Museum; and most recently, a walnut wood project honoring the seven crew members and thirty-three passengers of Flight 93, taken to Somerset PA to be placed in "The Flight 93 Museum". These were just a few of the many projects Jim has undertaken, not to mention the thousands of American flags he has distributed through the years, at his own expense. He is also a proud contributor to the Paralyzed Veterans of America, Vietnam Veterans of Michigan and Disabled Veterans National Fund.

Jim Decker has truly earned the honor of being our Grand Marshall for the 2010 Ada Township 4TH of July Parade! Give him a big cheer as he passes by!

ADA FARMERS' MARKET CONTINUES TO GROW

Emphasis on Fresh, Healthy and Local

Opening two weeks earlier this year on June 22 and staying open two weeks later until September 28, the Ada Farmers' Market continues to grow. The Market is determined to continue its reputation, recognized last year by vendors and customers alike, as "the friendly Market". Currently there are 34 seasonal vendors who will be in the Market for much of the new, expanded season and they will be occupying a record 50 spaces. Daily vendors may be added on a week-to-week basis. Taking place again in the parking lot of The Community church, hours have changed slightly with the Market opening every Tuesday at noon and staying open until 6 p.m. Seven new vendors have been carefully selected to be added to the Market and many of last year's vendors have taken more spaces in the Market. One of the Market's newest vendors will be the kids participating in the **Ada Village Kids Garden** project adjacent to the Market. HELP SAVE NATIVE WILDFLOWERS

It has already been growing since early spring when the winter snows receded from the woods, and has already produced flowers. However, it's not too late for you to help keep this invader at bay by removing it before its seeds are distributed in late summer.

Garlic mustard is one of the few non-native herbs capable of invading and dominating forest understory communities. It crowds out and eliminates native spring woodland ephemeral plants such as liverworts, toothworts, solomon-seal, trilliums, trout lilly, sweet-cisley and many others. Because it begins growing very early in the spring, garlic mustard has a head start on other flowering plants and tree seedlings.

Native woodland flowers are in danger of disappearing from our landscape because of this invader.

The photos on this page illustrate the varying forms this plant takes during its 2-year life cycle.

Pulling individual garlic mustard plants by hand is the simplest and most effective approach to managing small or isolated infestations. When pulling plants, it is important to remove the upper portion of the roots as well as the stem, since buds in the root crown can produce additional stems. All pulled plants should be removed from the site and bagged, as seed ripening continues if plants are pulled and left on the ground. Repeatedly hand pulling of garlic mustard is reported to be effective for control in small areas but has limitations. Because seeds remain viable in the soil for up to five years, it is important to pull all garlic mustard plants in an area every year until the seed bank is exhausted and seedlings no longer appear. This will require multiple efforts each year as rosettes can continue to bolt and produce flowers over an extended period (April-June).

ELECTIONS:

PRIMARY, August 3RD, 2010 • GENERAL, November 2ND, 2010

Elections are coming up in August and November this year. Here is a short overview of what will be on the ballot for the **August Primary Election**. (We will cover the November Election in the next issue of the AdaView.)

The August Primary will be an election in which you will vote either all Republican or all Democratic; no “split” ballots! You will be voting for the following partisan offices: State Legislature 86th District; State Senate 28th District; US House of Representatives 3rd District; the Governor / Lieutenant Governor; State Education Boards; County Drain Commission; County Commission 4th District; and precinct delegates. Additionally, there will be nonpartisan judicial seats on the ballot, and possibly some county level proposals.

Also on the ballot in August will be a referendum on the Heliport Ordinance. The language will appear as:

“The submission of Ada Township Zoning Ordinance Amendment No. 0-011209-5 (which imposes regulations on Heliports within Ada Township and was approved by the Ada Township Board on January 12, 2009) to the Electors for their approval.” If you would like to read the ordinance, you may find it on the Township website: www.adatownshipmi.com.

The November General Election will allow for “split-ticket” voting. Additionally, the Secretary of State and Attorney General positions will be on the November ballot.

It is extremely important that everyone exercise their right to vote. **Please vote on Tuesday, August 3rd, 2010!**

TAX PAYMENT METHODS

Tax bills are scheduled to be mailed out the last week of June. These bills are due by September 14, 2010, 5:00 p.m. Remember the Township DOES NOT accept postmarks as date received. You have several options in paying your bill:

- As always you may come into the Township offices Monday–Friday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. except for holidays when the offices are closed. There is a drive-up drop box located at the end of the sidewalk at the Thornapple River Dr entrance to the Township offices.
- You can sign up for ACH, which allows the Township's bank to deduct payment from your bank. Call our offices for more information. Forms are also available on our website.
- You can also make payments with a credit card either by phone (800) 272-9829 or log onto our website: www.adatownshipmi.com. See the back of tax bill for further instructions. There is a fee of 3% of the tax bill charged by the credit card clearinghouse.

CREDIT CARDS ARE NOT ACCEPTED AT THE TOWNSHIP OFFICES.

- You can mail your payment to our office by using the enclosed envelope. **REMEMBER THAT POSTMARKS ARE NOT ACCEPTED AS DATE RECEIVED. ALL PAYMENTS MUST BE IN OUR OFFICE BY SEPTEMBER 14, 2010, 5:00 p.m. TO BE CONSIDERED ON TIME.**
- The Township does accept partial payments after July 1ST when tax bills are released. Appropriate interest/penalties will apply to the unpaid balance after September 14TH.

SENIORS AND DISABLED CITIZENS OF ADA TOWNSHIP

Please take note: you can apply for a deferment for 2010 summer tax if your household income did not exceed \$40,000 for the preceding calendar year and you meet at least one of the following requirements:


- You are 62 years or older
- Paraplegic or Quadriplegic
- Eligible serviceperson, veteran widow or widower
- Blind person
- Totally and permanently disabled

You many pick up a form at the Township Treasurer's Office at 7330 Thornapple River Dr or call (616) 676-9191 ext. 27 to have a form mailed to you. The form is due September 14, 2010 by 5:00 p.m. If you had a deferment for 2009 a form will be or already has been mailed to you.

Update on Park Improvements

Ada Township Park Highlights

Plans are coming together to put in a volleyball court in Ada Township Park this year. It will be located near the basketball court and open for public use. The Parks & Recreation Department submitted a grant proposal to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources Water & Conservation Fund for improvements to the park playground and parking facilities. The grant is for work to be done in 2011. A design process for the playground renovations will take place this summer and fall. Your input and recommendations are welcome.

Roselle Park Stream and Drain work

When the old Ada Beef Plant was built, drain systems were put in place to divert water away from the building site and farm fields. As part of a Phase 1 of converting that property into Roselle Park, some renovations to the drain system were done but more work is needed prior to further development of the park site. This summer a section of a stream that was once diverted and buried will be re-opened to allow for a natural flow of surface water runoff. In addition, sections of blocked culverts in the main drain through the property will be cleared or replaced. It will look like some construction on site for a couple weeks, but the end result will be better flow of water through the site during rain and river flooding events, and a more natural appearance.


