



ROSELLE PARK RESOURCE BUILDING PROJECT UNDERWAY

Roselle Park, located at 1010 Grand River Drive in Ada, was once farm fields and is now 240 acres of parkland and nature preserve along the Grand River thanks to donors and the citizens of Ada Township. Early development in the park included a trail system, observation decks, a playground, parking areas, memorial benches and trees. This phase is to construct a Resource Center building that will have year round bathrooms available to park visitors and a multi-purpose room for education programs, meetings and special events.

Planning for a Resource Center building

at Roselle Park has been underway for several years and is now ready to move into the construction phase. Preliminary architectural designs and landscape plans have been completed as well as cost estimates. The construction documents will soon be finalized with the project going out to bid in June. In early July bids should be in and we will make a final decision on cost and starting time. If all goes well, construction will start in August with completion set for spring of 2016.

The Resource Center building is designed to include the following features:

- A 1,610 square foot meeting room with capacity for 100 people, audio-visual equipment and a fireplace.
- · Restroom facilities, available all year
- Outdoor patios on 2 sides of the building perimeter
- · An entry corridor with bench seating
- A 130 square foot kitchenette

- A small office and storage area of 190 square feet
- A 330 square foot storage room for equipment
- Native plants incorporated into the landscaping
- Part of the roof as a "green roof"
- Parking area across from Michigan Street
- · Accessible walkways connecting to the bike paths

Funding for the project has been identified through the Open Space Fund, supported by the Parks and Open Space Millage, by the Ada Township General Fund, and by private donations. Individuals, businesses, and corporations are encouraged to support this project through private donations. All donations are tax deductible and will be recognized in the building. Contributions may be targeted to support specific aspects of the Center such as trees, benches, furnishings, or directly toward the building. From one dollar to many, your donations are appreciated.



MEET THE NEWEST ADA TOWNSHIP FIREFIGHTERS

In the last addition of the Adaview a fire department recruiting card was the cover story. The card was to inform our community of the need for paid on call firefighters to fill positions left after the retirement of some firefighters. The response exceeded our expectations with twelve applicants. A few of those have all the required training, and will begin responding in a full service mode soon. Others will have a probationary period which gives them hands on experience prior to beginning a fall Firefighter 1 Class. This 240 hours of training begins in September and is completed in April. After completion of this class an 80 hour Medical First Responder class is taken. The first year is a big undertaking for these candidates taking class two nights a week and still managing a career and family. Additional hiring will be spread over the next few months as we prepare to send several candidates to the fall Firefighter class. These three firefighters will bring our membership to 19. We look forward to the addition to our Ada Fire Department family.

NEWS FROM DEPUTY ROE

The weather is warming! I know I have covered this topic before, but it is one that we continue to deal with: Children left unattended in cars. We all should know better. Every 8 days a child dies of heatstroke in a vehicle. These tragedies are preventable. Here are some tips to remind us:

- <u>NEVER</u> leave a child unattended in a vehicle, even for a minute. Keep the vehicles locked when not in use to prevent the children from getting in on their own.
- While transporting the children, especially infants, place something that you will need when exiting the vehicle, such as a purse, phone, or laptop, in the back seat. That way you will not forget and leave the child in the car if you get distracted or if the child falls asleep. Some people set a timer on their phone to go off when they arrive at work as a reminder to make sure they have dropped their child off at daycare.





Well sometimes minutes add up quicker than you think. In only 20 minutes the inside temperature of a vehicle can rise 30 degrees, even if you leave the windows open a little.

DON'T FORGET TO "SHARE THE ROAD"

Even though Ada Township has built separated pedestrian/bicycle trails on many roads, there are many cyclists for whom riding in the road best suits their riding style and abilities, as well as the interests of safety, even on roads that are adjoined by a separated path.

Drivers who encounter cyclists in the road should keep in mind that cyclists have the legal right to use the road, even when an off-street trail is adjacent to the road. Drivers should approach and pass cyclists in a cautious, courteous and safe manner, providing at least a 3-foot separation distance between your vehicle and the cyclist.





HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION DAY – SATURDAY, JULY 18

In conjunction with Kent County's Household Hazardous Waste Program, Cascade & Ada Townships are sponsoring a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday July 18th. Township residents wishing to dispose of their unused or unwanted household chemical waste are encouraged to bring them to this one day event. Chemicals such as weed killers, bug sprays, antifreeze, gasoline, oil-based paint, wood preservatives, paint thinner, pool chemicals, deck cleaners, fluorescent light bulbs, and mercury thermometers & thermostats can all be brought in for disposal.

The collection will run from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and will be held at Cascade Buttrick Station, 2990 Buttrick Ave. SE.

Latex Paint, medical waste, pharmaceuticals, ammunition and fireworks are not accepted through this program.

This Household Hazardous Waste Collection is for Ada and Cascade Township residents only. No materials from business, schools, institutions or commercial farmers can be accepted. Please be prepared to show your driver's license for proof of residency.



PUBLIC ACCESS IMPROVEMENTS COMPLETED AT OPEN SPACE PRESERVE


Work is nearly completed on parking improvements, unpaved nature trails, a wetland boardwalk and two pedestrian bridges over Carl Creek at the Carl Creek Crossing open space preserve on Grand River Dr. These improvements will provide enhanced opportunities for residents to access and enjoy this natural site.

The 8-acre property extends from Fulton St. to Grand River Dr. along the meandering creek, with a small parking area and trailhead located on Grand River Dr., across the street from the covered bridge on the Township's non-motorized trail.

Funding for the project is provided by the voter-approved Parks and Land Preservation millage.

FIELD REVIEWS AND PROPERTY QUESTIONNAIRES

Field reviews are being conducted in Ada Township as an ongoing effort to ensure consistent and accurate assessment data. Our department follows the State of Michigan's recommendation that 20% of a governmental unit be visited and inspected each year. To that end, owners of parcels being reviewed will also receive Property Review Questionnaires by mail and are asked to return completed questionnaires to the Ada Township assessing office.

In addition, property owners are strongly encouraged to review their parcel information on the Ada Township website. Property details can be accessed under the government tab by choosing the Assessing Department and continuing to the Property/Assessment Search link.

REGARDING SOLICITORS

There is no question Ada is an attractive, thriving community. Door to door solicitors also find our community attractive! Even though the township has always had a solicitation ordinance which required a "solicitation permit", the old solicitation ordinance wasn't effective as this community more frequently became the focus of solicitation.

In 2011 Ada Township, in an effort to protect our citizens, developed a new more restrictive Solicitation Ordinance, in partnership with the Kent County Sheriff's Department and our neighbors Cascade and Grand Rapids townships. We worked together to create a common ordinance that could be enforced the same in all three municipalities. Solicitors traveling from one township to another would follow the same ordinance restrictions, eliminating enforcement confusion.

The following are brief highlights from the current Solicitation Ordinance:

- 1. Anyone seeking a solicitation permit must go to the Clerk's office. The permits expire in 30 days but can be renewed. There is a \$50 fee for every permit. EXEMPTED solicitors include: schools, churches, government, charities, nonprofit or religious organizations (do not need a permit but must pre-register with the clerk).
- All applicants (except for those in the EXEMPT category) are subject to background checks for criminals and sex offenders.
- 3. The Township Clerk may revoke a permit at any time.
- 4. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction be charged with a criminal misdemeanor and a fine and/or imprisonment in the county jail. Repeat offenders will also be subject to increased fines.
- 5. Solicitation dates and times:April 1 to September 30; 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.October 1 to March 31; 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

What You As Residents Need To Look For:

- Other than the dates and times above, never open your door to anyone you suspect is a solicitor.
- If a solicitor doesn't have an Ada Township Solicitation permit attached to their outer clothing in plain sight, you should call the Sheriff.
- Report any suspicious looking strangers walking or driving the neighborhood.
- Report any solicitor who isn't respectful of you or your wishes.

ROAD PROJECTS PLANNED FOR SUMMER MONTHS

The Kent County Road Commission will be completing several road repair and upkeep projects in Ada Township this summer, in a funding partnership with the Township. Following is a list of planned projects:

- Milling and resurfacing of the entire length of Fase Street.
- Milling and resurfacing of streets in Ada Meadows and Woodmont subdivisions (Meadowmeade Dr., West Woodmeade Ct., East Woodmeade Ct.)
- Application of a thin pavement overlay to N. Maple Hill Ave., Clements Mill Dr., Highbury Dr. and Hartfield Dr. in Clements Mill
- Resurfacing of Steketee Ave.


Ada Township is providing \$250,000 to the Road Commission (50% of the total cost) to make these investments in the Township's local road network.

In addition to the projects listed above, the Road Commission will be completing chip-sealing and microsurfacing on portions of several other roads in the Township, including Ada Drive, Alta Dale Ave, Michigan St. and Pettis Ave., with the entire cost borne by the Road Commission.

TAX PAYMENT METHODS

Tax bills are scheduled to be mailed out July 1, 2015. These bills are due by September 14, 2015, 5:00 p.m. If you have not received a copy please give our office a call. We will be happy to reprint and mail or e-mail one to you. Remember the Township **DOES NOT** accept postmarks. The date received is considered date paid. You have several options in paying your bill:

- As always you may come into the Township offices Monday – Friday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. except for holidays when the offices are closed. There is a drive-up drop box located at the end of the sidewalk at the Thornapple River Dr. entrance to the Township offices.
- You can sign up for ACH, which allows the Township's bank to deduct payment from your bank. Call our offices for more information. Forms are also available on our website.




- You can also make payments with a credit/debit card by logging onto our website: www.adatownshipmi.com, or call 1-888-891-6064 (press 1). See the back of tax bill for further instructions. wE NOW ACCEPT CREDIT/DEBIT CARDS AT THE TOWNSHIP OFFICES. There is a fee of 3% of the tax bill charged by the credit card clearinghouse for any credit/debit card transaction no matter where you make the payment.
- You can mail your payment to our office by using the enclosed envelope. REMEMBER THAT POSTMARKS ARE NOT ACCEPTED. THE DATE RECEIVED IS CONSIDERED DATE PAID. ALL PAYMENTS MUST BE IN OUR OFFICE BY SEPTEMBER 14, 2015, 5:00 p.m. TO BE CONSIDERED ON TIME.
- The Township <u>does accept</u> partial payments starting on July 1st when tax bills are released. Appropriate interest/penalties will apply to the <u>unpaid balance</u> after September 14th.

SENIORS AND DISABLED CITIZENS OF ADA TOWNSHIP

Please take note: you can apply for a deferment for 2015 summer tax if your household income <u>did not</u> exceed \$40,000 for the preceding calendar year and you meet at least one of the following requirements:

- You are 62 years or older
- Paraplegic or Quadriplegic
- Eligible serviceperson, veteran widow or widower
- Blind person
- · Totally and permanently disabled



If you had a deferment for 2014 a form will be or has been automatically mailed to you. You many pick up a form at the Township Treasurer's Office at 7330 Thornapple River Dr or call (616) 676-9191 ext. 27 to have a form mailed to you. The form is due September 14, 2015 by 5:00 p.m.

Ada Park Shelter & Gazebo Rentals: Available April through October. Contact the Park office for reservations.

Athletic Fields: Used for area leagues, instructional programs and general public.

Basketball & Tennis Courts: Open to public except during scheduled programs. Tennis Courts #5 and #6 are set up for Pickle Ball.

Walking & Bike Paths: Located throughout the Township and in all the Parks. Contact the Park office or web site for map.
